

Judge Kevin R. Anderson:

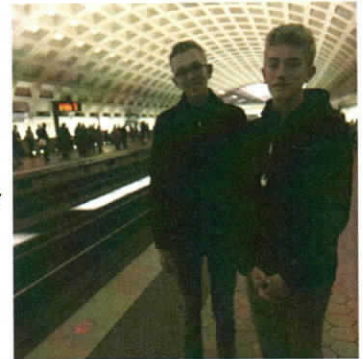

Invested \$10,000 into Vidangel shares after 11 months of use.

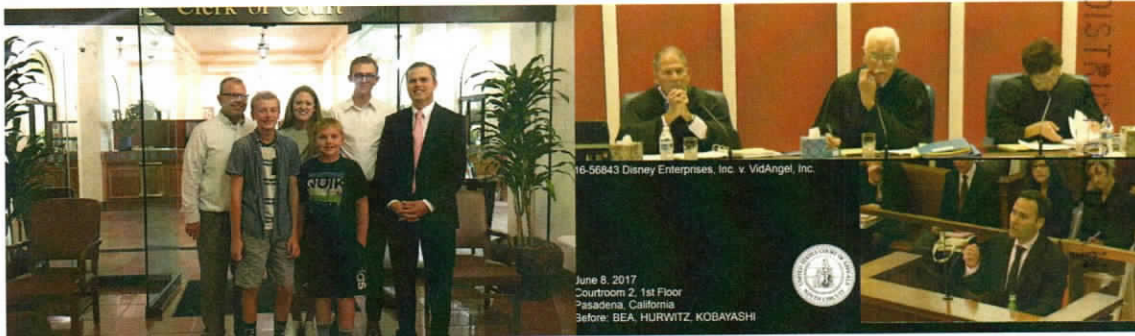
President's weekend 2017

June 8, 2017 - 9th Circuit Court of Appeals Hearing California

Early morning on June 8, my family traveled to the Salt Lake City Airport and flew to Burbank California to show our family's support of Vidangel at the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals Hearing. This was our first experience in an appeals hearing. Very disappointing. There was no room for my family to be seated - no one cleared the room from the appeal before - I'm confident that Disney had their people arrive early in the morning and sit throughout the day until their case against Vidangel so that no form of support could be seen. My son and I were able to sit in the courtroom - the rest of my family was taken to an overflow room. After listening to the entire process, again I was very disappointed in the three Judges. First two of them were caught saying that this case would be easy before the hearing even began. Then the one of judges began speaking along one thought that ate up most of the time Vidangel's lawyer had. Disney's lawyer spoke at length about nothing of substance. The substance of everything is if the consumer has the right to consume a product or service that they purchase or rent for a period of time as they desire. My family then flew back to Salt Lake City that evening.
